




OUR LADY & ST TERESA'S SCHOOL NEWSLETTER – 13TH MARCH 2020

Maths Challenge Answers for last week

YR – A: 9
 Y1 & 2 – A: 12
 Y3 & 4 – A: 3/5
 Y5 & 6 – 100

Maths Challenge

Year R - Quiet Koala adds two numbers together. One number is one bigger than the other. He has 11. What are the numbers?

Year 1 & 2 – $\frac{3}{4}$ of the length of a piece of wood is 9cm. What is the total length?

Year 3 & 4 – $\frac{1}{3}$ of the amount of children in a school is the same as $\frac{1}{2}$ of the boys. There are 34 more girls. How many in the school?

Year 5 & 6 – On a map, for every 6.5cm, the actual length is 9 miles. The actual distance is 72 miles. What would the length on the map be?

Challenge – Two pieces of wood are the same length. After cutting piece A by 34cm and piece B by 50cm piece B is $\frac{2}{3}$ the length of piece A. How long were the pieces?
